The 2023 "Ironman" Reunion is ON

We're very happy to announce that the 2023 USS Reeves Ironman Reunion is officially scheduled for October 5th through 8th 2023. This event is to be held in Miamisburg, Ohio, which is a suburb of the City of Dayton. We chose this location for a number of reasons, and really think that it suits all our needs.

We knew we had our work cut out for us to beat the Colorado Springs venue, so we got into the reunion planning right away. Our goals were to return to our normal October dates and find our way to the middle of the country. Our routine has always been to move the reunions around the country to bring it as close to as many shipmates as possible, while always finding something fun to see. We are on our third lap of moving around the country East to West to the Middle, and it's the Middles turn. We were in Chicago in 2008, and San Antonio in 2016. That left plenty of choices, so we got revised Request-for-Proposal (RFP) out to our target cities.

We found the hotel industry not quite recovered from the COVID tailspin, and they were slow to respond. It took a few tries before we heard back from individual hotels. We found most were priced way above what we had in mind and were not willing to bargain. We did hear from hotels in larger cities, like Nashville, and found that they were far more expensive than we thought our members would like. Not being a \$200.00+ per night + taxes crowd, we stuck with affordability.

We got decent proposals from hotels in Cincinnati, Dayton, and Kentucky that were well aimed at getting our business. We narrowed down the best prices and perks before ending up with two hotels that met all our needs. Both were in the Dayton area, and both were competitive. The decision boiled down laying eyes on both venues to decide. This is where our VP, Gerry Hines, stepped up to save the day. Gerry and Janet were travelling cross -country and agreed to check-out both hotels. The hotel in Dayton was eliminated, and the one in Miamisburg was deemed an excellent choice. Gerry met with the manager and favorably resolved the last few contract items before signing the contract.

The hotel selected for the 2023 Reunion is the **DoubleTree Suites by Hilton Hotel Dayton/Miamisburg Ohio.** It is a modern, four-star hotel located at 300 Prestige Place in Dayton/Miamisburg Ohio. 45342. The hotel is relatively new and has a lot of amenities that we think will serve our purposes. The Doubletree is located within walking distance of the Dayton Mall Shopping Center and a variety of Restaurants. The location has plentiful and secure parking areas, with room for RVs. Dayton International Airport (DAY) is 22 Miles away. The Dayton Airport serves Delta, United, American, Allegiant, and Avelo Airlines. According to the airport website, there are a variety of direct flights to Dayton. Unfortunately, the hotel does not offer airport shuttle service. We're working out a method with local suppliers to incorporate the airport transit costs into our reunion expenditures, with the goal of hotel / airport transit to be free to Reeves Association guests – more to follow.

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Hotel room pricing for our reunion stay is **\$119.00 per night** for their two-room suites, with the choice of either two twin beds or a one king bed. This fee includes free parking (for cars and RVs), free Wi-Fi, free breakfast - every day, discounts at the hotel bar and restaurants, and access to the Association hospitality room and banquet facilities.

Please keep in mind that the negotiated rate may appear to be a little higher than what you may see on the hotels website. The prices you see there are currently \$99 to \$120 per night, so \$119 does not seem to be much of a deal. The dates you'll see now are for off-season rates. If you plug in our dates in October, you'll find that the rates average about \$144 per night (without breakfast). Our negotiated rate is guaranteed not to increase, and with the way prices are moving these days, that alone is worth consideration. The rate is also available two days before and after our reunion.

Booking the hotel room in Dayton is surprisingly easy.

To make the reservation online, go to <u>https://www.guestreservations.com/doubletree-suites-by-hilton-hotel-dayton-miamisburg/booking?msclkid=6cbfc16119dd11b8fafea2dd90307160</u> and enter code URA in the group rate box to get our negotiated rate. -Or- You can call the hotel at (937) 436-2400 and ask to get the USS Reeves Association rates for October 5-8, 2023. You still may have to have the URA code handy to make sure you get our rate. There is no advance payment required to confirm your reservation. The discount hotel room price actually expire 30 days before the re-union, so it's rather important to make those reservations well in advance. There's no penalty for cancellation but making them too late could be costly. We have our normal agreement with the hotel for reunion pricing two days before and after our reunion times.

The other per person cost for attending the reunion is the participation costs for our reunion stay. The rooms, as usual, are the responsibility of each attendee. The participant costs are those which each attendee pays to the association and are in addition to the room fees. Those fees cover all the other stuff that makes the reunion worthwhile. They cover the incidental costs like event insurance, the Friday night reception, the cost for your banquet meals, event ballcaps, reunion bling, door prizes, and most importantly.... keeping the hospitality room stocked with all your favorite snacks and adult beverages. We always try to keep that cost as low as possible, but it normally ends up being about the same as the cost for one room night.

We normally don't understand all the costs when we select that number, but in the past, it has worked out. I just want to make sure you understand what the participant fee is all about, and its importance to us at least breaking even on the reunion.

The routine for the reunion will be the same as we have used over the last few years. We will set-up for business in our hospitality room on Thursday afternoon October 5th and be ready for all our guests. On Friday October 6th, we are planning a day trip to the Wright-Patterson Air Force Base to check out their Research and Development (R&D) Facility, have lunch on the road, and return back to the hotel for our Friday Evening Reception Party.

Saturday we are planning a bus trip to the US Air Force National Museum at Wright-Patterson AFB, which is only 16.5 miles from our hotel. This is one of the most spectacular museums that you'll ever get to see. It is loaded with everything that flies from the early days of aviation (Wilbur and Orville were from the neighborhood) through WWI, the next huge hangar is a complete exhibit of WWII aircraft and memorabilia, the next giant hangar (my favorite) is the cold war exhibit that has an amazing number of really fabulous planes. There are additional hangars with many historic aircraft that will completely surprise you. Mary and I have been there twice, and still haven't seen it all. The best part about the museum tour is that it is a freebie. In addition, our intention is to have lunch at the Wright-Patterson AFB Officers Club on the day of our museum tour. There are also a variety of other cool things to do in the area, so you won't



even have to consider being bored. Check out the museum at https://www.nationalmuseum.af.mil/

We still have to get everyone to the museum safely, so we'll once again charter a bus. We don't have the cost for the bus ride nailed down, so we'll cover that later. We have some calls out for prices, but no responses yet. Saturday night will be a quiet evening at the hotel hanging out in our hospitality room telling mostly accurate sea stories, or perhaps visiting local restaurants.

Sunday will be a busy day as well. Sunday morning is quiet time to relax or do whatever you like. That afternoon will be the association business meeting at the hotel, where we will discuss our association, have an election of association officers, and talk about where the next reunion takes us. Early rumors aim us at the possibility of seeing an even better aviation museum in perhaps Pensacola (shhhh, it's still a secret). We're also planning an event for the ladies to feel good about missing our business meeting. It was widely circulated that the ladies alternate event last year (sip and paint) was more fun than our business meeting, but we just can't imagine how that's even possible.

Sunday evening will be our Reunion Banquet in the hotel banquet room. This will include posting of the colors, our Two-Bell Memorial service, a cash bar for the banquet, a delicious plated dinner, and some very exciting speech making. We are already in touch with the Navy League in Dayton to see if we can be provided with a key-note speaker. We fully realize that it will be difficult to beat the fabulous speaker we had in Colorado Springs, but we're fully committed to doing just that. After the banquet we'll adjourn to our hospitality room for our raffle.

Monday will be the usual break down of the hospitality room and a return to normalcy for most of us.

We really think you'll like the venue we've come up with for 2023. Our objective was to find the best hotel for the money, that also just happens to be located close to an attraction worth visiting. I think we found both in Dayton, so now we can move along to get everything in place for this to be an excellent reunion. Booking the hotel this far in advance gives us plenty of time to attend to all the things that make our reunions special. We look forward to seeing you all in October 2023 for the next best Reeves Reunion you've ever been to.

Haze Grey and Underway (Again)! By Jeff Wofford-USS Reeves 76-80

It's been almost 43 years since my last underway on board the USS Reeves. One of the things I loved about the Navy were the underway periods. I loved being at sea! Yea, sometimes the work schedule sucked. The food was questionable at times and often un-edible. But being at sea made it all worthwhile. I always slept good on the ship. All the background noise and vibrations of the ship moving through the water lulled me to sleep.

Last week I ended up joining my son on the USS Kearsarge as they finished up their North Atlantic and Baltic Sea Deployment. I got to spend a few days on the ship on the "Tiger Cruise". This is the second time I've been able to do this. I met my son-in-law in Pearl Harbor in 2009 and rode back to the West coast with him on the USS Tarawa.

Last week's trip started with meeting at the Norfolk Navy Exchange at 2:30 AM. We departed on a bus at 3, heading for Camp Lejeune near Jacksonville NC. The bus ride was the only bad part of the trip. The two bus drivers (we'll call them Mo and Ron) were older cantankerous retired Air Force guys with a serious attitude problem. Mo and Ron didn't believe in fancy gadgets like GPS, or maps for that matter, so off they went with a basic idea of where we were going. They got lost and it took six hours instead of four to get to Camp Lejeune. We drove up to the beach where two LCACs were waiting for us. On the beach.



An LCAC (Landing Craft Air Cushion) is the big hydrofoil that the Navy uses to haul vehicles and troops or the Marine Corps. They can put a personnel module on it, and it can carry up to 60 people. Although you do feel a little like a sardine.

Off in the distance, the USS Kearsarge waited for us to head out to meet them.

Riding out on the LCAC was an experience. The ride itself was smooth, but it has a weird feel to it. It only had two little windows in each crew module, so you can't see much. After about a ten-minute ride, we slid into the well deck of the Kearsarge.

We went up to the flight deck to look around. I have to admit, it was great to be back out to sea on a Navy ship! Not a bad view.

After a short welcome aboard meeting from the Captain, we all headed out with our families to get lunch prior to the Air Power Demo. Since my son is a Lt. Commander, I got to eat in the wardroom. I have to admit, that's not a bad way to go. The food was good, and everyone seemed happy to have us on board.

After lunch we went up to the O6 level and watched the Air Power Demo. The Marines flew an MV-22 Osprey and a couple of AV-8B Harriers, and the Navy flew a demo on an SH-60 Knighthawk.

The rest of the day was spent cruising up the coast of North Carolina heading toward Norfolk. I got to spend some time up in the control tower and checking other areas of the ship. They rolled out the carpet for dinner and served steak and lobster and then had ice cream and cake to celebrate the Navy's Birthday.

I went up to the front of the flight deck to watch the sunset. There's really nothing like watching the sunset at sea. After that I went up to the tower with my son and several cigars. It turns out that there is a 20'x 20' deck behind the tower. The Air department guys refer to it as the back porch. At the back of the tower, you go through a small hatch and out onto the back porch. Conveniently, they stow several fold up chairs. We sat out on the back porch and enjoyed the evening with a good cigar and some great conversation. As John and Andy would appreciate, one of the guys brought out his guitar and started playing. He was good at ad libbing songs. One of his favorites was "Love in the fan room" where he described an incident that happened earlier in the deployment where during a man overboard drill, the discovered two crew were missing (one male and one female). They were both Ems and so their chief had a good idea where they were. And yes, they were caught in the act and the mini boss wrote a song about it.

After the cigars, I headed to bed. It had been a long day. I was assigned to a four- person stateroom and there was only one other person in there with me. Definitely a big improvement over the berthing compartments on the Reeves. I even had a sink in the room!

I climbed into the rack and laid down. As I reflected on the day, it really brought back a lot of memories. Unless you served at sea, you would never understand, but there is a unique feeling to life aboard a Navy ship. As I drifted off to sleep, I heard all the background noise, the 1MC, ventilation fans, and felt the subtle vibration of the ship moving at sea. There's a repetitive throbbing that's almost like a heartbeat. I realize it's the vibration the screws make as they propel the ship, but maybe it is more than that. We all anthropomorphize a ship. We refer to them a she or her. I think the snipes understand this better than anyone, but I do think it is the ships heartbeat. I drifted off to sleep listening to the life of the USS Kearsarge. I went to sleep truly happy and slept like a log.

I got up early the next morning. My son and I got breakfast and then went up to the flight deck in time to see the sun rise. I followed Jared around as he did his morning inspections. He is the safety Officer for the ship.

Before long it was time to get ready to come into port. They set sea and anchor detail, and everyone had to get changed into their whites. We hung out in the flight deck control room until it was time to man the rails.

Before long, lines were sent ashore, and the Flag was shifted. Within a short amount of time, we mustered in the hanger deck to go ashore. As I walked off the ship, I realized how fortunate that I have been to be able to go out on two Tiger Cruises and relive what it was like to be at sea. We always hear about there's no such thing as a former Marine. I think the same goes for a sailor. I think once we have served together on US Navy Ship at sea, we form a bond not only with our shipmates, but with the sea and to some degree with the Navy. So, I guess once a sailor, always a sailor.

As I walked up the pier with my son heading toward a reunion with our family, it dawned on me that this would probably be the last time at sea for me (at least courtesy of the Navy). I have to admit that I was a little sad. Much of my success is due to what I learned in the Navy. Not so long ago, someone asked what my key to success was. I told them generally, the US Navy, but more specifically, the USS Reeves. So, as I finish this up, all my best goes to my Reeves shipmates.
